FCCer **Katie Cramer** is a bright happy 16yr old in 10th grade. She's active in her church's high school ministry, student leadership and volleyball team. Katie was just crowned "second Princess" in the Miss Teen Asia Sacramento 2010 pageant, and days later was informed of her Acute Myeloid Leukemia (AML) relapse.

Katie was born in the Guangxi region of southern China and adopted by an American family in California. Katie's AML had been treated four years ago, but the AML recently came out of remission and is more aggressive than ever. Only a stem cell or bone marrow donor can save her life.
